Edinburgh brings the world's cleft professionals together

We have had the most exceptional summer at Smile Train UK. In fact, for a week in July, Scotland became the centre of the cleft universe when some of the world's leading practitioners in cleft surgery and cleft care travelled to Edinburgh for the 14th International Cleft Congress - Cleft 2022.

Each of the more than 1,500 delegates — including Smile Train partners from 50+ countries — brought a burning desire to collaborate and advance knowledge and best practices for those born with clefts. Over four days, these distinguished professionals shared their skills, clinical experiences, and findings from current research, as well as their aspirations for improving the future of cleft care. The atmosphere was buzzing, and Twitter feeds were alight with excitement and praise for both the formal and informal sessions.

We even linked up in real time with Rwanda Military Hospital in Kigali for the European debut of the new Bilateral Cleft Lip and Palate Simulator from Simulare Medical, a Division of Smile Train. We are committed to providing the speech therapy, dental treatment, orthodontics, and more each patient needs to communicate clearly and smile their brightest. Smile Train empowers cleft professionals on five continents to provide the essential, non-surgical care their patients need to thrive.

Building the self-esteem and confidence to walk out with a new smile isn't always easy, especially for children who have known little besides bullving and harassment from neighbours and peers. Mamie Woodman's Gift

Earlier this year, we discovered that a very special lady, Mamie Woodman, had remembered Smile Train in her Will. We were delighted to hear more of Mamie's life story from her family.

Mamie's father died when she was three years old. Her mother struggled to make ends meet for her five girls, and when Mamie was 10, the family moved from Northumberland to Ilford in Essex to be nearer Mamie's older sister, Rita, who was studying nursing there. Leaving school, Mamie worked as a typist for different

companies in the City of London, and through a friend, met her future husband, Stuart Woodman. Married life took Mamie, Stuart, and their fouryear-old son Robert to Toronto, where Stuart's mother and sister lived.

Even through the death of her son at age 29 and the loss of her husband just five years later, Mamie always remembered a relative who had spent so much of his childhood



undergoing cleft treatments. Mamie recalled at least 13 surgeries before he was five years old; as he grew, his teeth even had to be removed.

Collaboration creates vibrant, child-safe, child-friendly operating rooms

Speaking of Scotland, Smile Train has developed a unique partnership with a vibrant and tenacious new Scottish charity – Kids Operating Room.

Any surgery is scary. For a child who may not fully understand the reason or the potential outcomes of their procedure, high-tech equipment and medical teams in scrubs can seem alien and intimidating, and being taken to an operating theatre may be truly traumatic. Working together since September 2021, Smile Train and KidsOR have already created state-of-the-art paediatric operating rooms at 13 Smile Train partner hospitals across Africa. Equipped with over 3,000 items, including child-sized surgical tools that make surgery safer, each room is also adorned with colourful wall art featuring animals, trains, and balloons to create a more welcoming, reassuring, and child-friendly space.

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
